- <u>Graduate Courses:</u> All courses are three credits unless otherwise stated. FYI...3 college credits equal 67.5 PDPs. The Center, in partnership with the offices of Continuing Education at Framingham and Worcester State Universities, offers elective courses designed for students with baccalaureate degrees and appropriate teaching credentials. These courses are graduate level, developed primarily for professional advancement. They are not part of any degree program. Seek approval of appropriate district or college officials before enrolling in these courses to satisfy any degree, state credential, or local school district requirement. Any course number that begins with CI971-R is a WSU course; any course number that begins with PRDV is a FSU course.
- <u>Withdrawal Policy:</u> Full refund prior to first class; 80% after first class; no refund thereafter. This policy is consistent with Worcester and Framingham State universities. Withdrawals must be in writing, mailed, emailed or faxed to French River. Failure to follow this procedure will result in a grade of F.
- <u>Attendance</u>: 100% attendance is expected. Participants cannot receive a grade of A if absent for 6 hours. Participants must consult with instructors to make up for any loss of time in class if a class is missed.
- <u>Note:</u> Courses will be cancelled due to low enrollment so we suggest you register for your course sooner rather than later. In order for the Center to have an accurate course registration count, it is better to register and withdraw (with full tuition reimbursement) than to wait until the last minute. Delayed registrations may result in course cancellations.



Seminar Series Overview:

Designed to meet the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education's preliminary license requirements relative to 'subject matter competencies' in moderate disabilities (603 CMR 7.00 – Regulations for Educator Licensure and Preparation Program Approval – subsection 4a), this seminar series will introduce participants to federal and state laws/regulations pertaining to special education, as well as educational terminology for students with mild to moderate disabilities. Participants will also learn how to prepare, implement, and evaluate Individualized Education Plans (IEPs). Additionally, participants will learn to design and/or modify curriculum, instructional, and assessment materials for students with moderate disabilities in the general education classroom environments while also learning ways to prepare and maintain students with disabilities for general education classrooms. The seminar series will also provide knowledge of services provided by other agencies to special education students and families with an emphasis on transitional services for special education students as well as instruction on the appropriate use of augmentative and alternative communication and other assistive technologies.

NOTE: Classroom discipline strategies will be integrated throughout the seminar series. We will review the behavior manifestation protocol and student due process rights. We will also look at positive behavioral interventions and the roll of BCBA and ABA in the special education and inclusion classroom.

Seminar Series Objectives (aligned with DESE Required Subject Matter Knowledge Competencies):

- * To understand and use educational terminology for students with mild to moderate disabilities (10 hours);
- * To learn how to prepare, implement, and evaluate Individualized Education Plans (IEPs) (10 hours);

- * To design and/or modify curriculum, instructional and assessment materials for general education classroom environments for students with moderate disabilities (10 hours);
- * To know and understand Federal and state laws and regulations pertaining to special education (10 hours);
- * To know and be able to access services provided by other agencies for students with disabilities. (10 hours);
- * To understand ways to prepare and maintain students with disabilities for general education classrooms (10 hours); and
- * To understand the appropriate use of augmentative and alternative communication and other assistive technologies. (10 hours).

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Preliminary License Candidates:

"Teaching Reading, Math, and English/Language Arts to Students of All Ability Levels in the Elementary School" and "Including Special Needs Students" A forty (40) hour seminar series for those seeking a <u>preliminary license</u> in Elementary Education, Early Childhood Education, or Moderate Disabilities.

ATTENTION.....If you are pursuing a <u>preliminary license</u> in any of the above referenced licensure fields, please be advised that, in addition to possessing a Bachelor's degree, a passing score on the MTELs and appropriate subject matter tests, the *Regulations for Educator Licensure* (603 CMR 7.04) also require teacher candidates to complete a seminar series on the teaching of Reading (10 hours), Math (10 hours), English/Language Arts (10 hours), and Inclusion (10 hours) <u>unless you have already had any of these as undergraduate courses</u>.

(NOTE: Moderate Disabilities candidates do not need the "Including Special Needs Students" seminar series.)

French River has a program, which is approved by the Department of Education and designed to satisfy this requirement. Tuition for the complete seminar series is \$500 or \$125 per ten (10) hour series. We accept personal checks, Visa, MasterCard, and Discover credit cards.

(Since this entire series is online, you will start when your registration and payment is received)

~Reading (10 hours)

This seminar will focus on basic principles of teaching developmental reading to students of all ability levels. Current research-based principles for teaching phonemic awareness, phonics, vocabulary, reading comprehension, and language arts will be emphasized.

~Math (10 hours)

Through case studies, professional articles, hands-on activities, and internet sites, participants will gain knowledge and insight on how best to teach math to students of all ability levels. In addition, participants will review policies and procedures related to the inclusion of students with moderate special needs into the general population, and will explore methods to modify general math instruction for these students.

~English/Language Arts (10 hours)

This seminar is designed to assist those teaching English language arts to present the subject matter effectively in the inclusion classroom. Focus areas include implementation of 504 plans and IEPs as it relates to English language arts; communication with parents; learning strategies; and behavior management.

~Including Special Needs Students (10 hours)

The Individuals with Disabilities Act (IDEA) provides the foundation for inclusive schooling, requiring that every child with a disability receive a free and appropriate education and learn in the least restrictive environment. One approach to achieve the requirements of the law is to "retrofit", i.e., solving problems after the fact in an attempt to fit a student into the existing framework. An alternative approach is "universal design", i.e., differentiated materials, methods, and assessment alternatives are considered and created in advance with the full range of students' differences in mind. This seminar will also introduce participants to the concept of universal design. (NOTE:

Moderate disabilities licensure candidates do not need to enroll in this fourth seminar).

Possession of a Massachusetts Sheltered English Immersion (SEI) Teacher Endorsement.

Possession of an Initial license for this field and at this grade level.

At least three full years of employment under the Initial license including completion of a one-year induction program with a mentor and 50 hours of mentored experience beyond the induction year.


AND:

For those who have completed any master's or higher degree or other advanced graduate program in an accredited college or university, at least 12 credits of graduate level courses in the subject matter knowledge or pedagogy based on the subject matter knowledge of the Professional license sought; these may include credits earned prior to application for the license

French River can help you develop the IPDP, we have a template and can even keep track of your IPDP to ensure you are on track to re-license


The 150 breaks down as follow:

- *At least 15 PDPs in content (subject matter knowledge)
- *At least 15 PDPs in pedagogy (professional skills and knowledge)
- *90 PDPs may be earned through either "elective" activities that address other educational issues and topics that improve student learning, or additional content, and/or pedagogy.

(optional) If you have an additional license (you need 30 additional PDPs for each license)
